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

In this most recent installment of Newly Minted, we highlighted 28 top executives who either stepped into their roles in 2025 or who were announced to be stepping into their roles in early 2026. These individuals hold various titles, including CEO, president, executive director and others, but across the board, each of them are among the highest-ranking leaders at their companies overall or within their companies' presences in the Pittsburgh region. They represent a number of different sectors, including but not limited to banking and finance, higher education, nonprofits, tech, health care, restaurants and construction.

Each of these individuals has been selected to lead their companies or organizations forward, to pick up the baton from their predecessors and to continue momentum toward big goals.
